We start this member profile with a big Thank You for your club support and participation. It is because of you and many like you throughout the years that have brought so much joy to our lives. We cherish all the great memories we have that all trace back to our Little British Cars and the adventures and friendships they have opened for us. We haven't been as active in the club these past few years, due to health reasons, but we so look forward to the times when we can participate.

My (Greg's) LBC journey started back in the Spring of '77 when I was turned down for my high school prom. To console himself, I went car shopping and came home with a '74 Triumph Spitfire. This led to several adventures with the Tri-Cities' Sand and Sage Sports car club. This also led to me learning how to work on cars by trial and error, lots of errors. The Spit found a new home in the fall of 78 when I replaced it with an RX7.

Our joint life journey started in September of '78 and the first thing Carole said about the RX was how impractical it was. So at least I knew she wasn't marrying me for my car. And marry we did, in March of '79 and the RX left shortly thereafter.

A year later (and with our first child on the way) Carole encouraged me to scratch my LBC itch when I found a '59 TR 3a for the hefty sum of \$1500. It was white (with a bit of rust) at the time. We named her Rita. Rita served us well as a second car and my daily driver. Of course, it gave me many more opportunities to learn more about fixing cars.

The next decade brought another child, several local moves and then a big promotion at work which required our move to Edmonds, WA in '86. Our faithful Rita moved with us, though I did have to drive her over the pass in the dead of winter without a heater.

It was during our time in Edmonds that saw both of us finish our BA & BS degrees, Carole's in Education, and mine in Business. We added an Alfa Graduate for Carole, an '84 Jag XJ6 (Victoria) and a '71 Stag (Arthur) for family outings. Unfortunately, it was also during this time that we learned that Carole had MS. Among many other changes, it also led to the Alfa finding a new home due to its lack of power steering. On a positive note, it was in Edmonds where we joined the local Triumph club (Tyee), met a lot of fine folks, had a lot of great adventures, and where I first served as a President in a Car club. I say I, but it was really both of us that served because I couldn't have done it without Carole's help and support.

Our next big move prompted by my company came in '96 to Long Beach, California. What a fantastic change after ten years of drizzle. We lived 5 miles from the beach, 10 for Disney, and about an hour from the San Gabrial Mountains. And even better, we joined the Southern California Triumph Owners Association. As our kids were both in high school by this time, it afforded us many more opportunities to be involved with the club. We served as newsletter editor, president, and then finally as the Triumphest coordinator / host. (Triumphest is a 3-day gathering of Triumph owners from California and Arizona. It was also during this time that our trusty Rita received a much-needed rolling refurbishment, taking this opportunity to return her to her original powder blue. Once completed we took her on a grand adventure along highway 1 and 101 up to Vancouver, B.C. and back for the 2001 All Triumph Drive In. We refer to this adventure as our fire and ice trip. Freezing on the northern California coast and getting roasted almost everywhere else. Without ever a complaint from Rita.



It was in California that we added a '70 GT 6+ (Rocky) and an '80 TR 7 convertible (Trouble) to the fleet. I used Rocky to Autocross, and Trouble as a door stop. I spent more time working on Trouble than driving, so it left us withing a few months.

The late '90s early 2000's brought a lot of changes, mostly good. The kids graduated and began their own lives. Our son took Rocky and joined the Navy, found his life partner and blessed us with grandchildren. They now reside in Maryland. Our daughter went to Berkeley & Columbia, to become a Historical Preservationist in San Fransico. To say the least, we are very proud of them. Unfortinally, this period also saw Carole's MS grow to the point that she was forced to take medical retirement. It was really hard leaving a career that was much more of a calling than it was a job. My career was also winding down.
